


PDO aims to maintain a safe and healthy environment working correcting situations that caused or could likely cause injury or damage. When an incident occurs, it is important to report the occurrence so corrective actions could be taken to make sure that a similar or more serious incidents do not re-occur. An incident is defined as "an unplanned and undesired event or chain of events that have, or could have, resulted in injury or illness, damage to assets, environment, reputation, company and/or consequential business loss". Normally, staff are good in reporting incidents with consequences. However, reporting near miss incidents is as important as reporting incident s with consequences. Near miss incidents are gifts that enable us to learn and rectify the situation before it escalates to injuries or damages.

HSE Advice
